Not too far away, college president Brennan Randolph, as well as several faculty, staff and early-report students, gathered on both sides of The Avenue to give new campus students a warm, lively welcome.

The welcome included bubbles, music, noisemakers and "Welcome to the Woods" signs. Those gathered on each side of The Avenue cheered on the new campus arrivals after the incoming students received a personal greeting and welcome from the college president.

The annual tradition is something the campus looks forward to, Randolph said.

"It's fun for faculty and staff to come out and welcome them. I think it helps students and families to see a little bit about who we are, the family-like atmosphere and the culture we talk about in the admissions process," Randolph said.

Campus enrollment will be "very similar" to last year, he reported, with about 217 new students and about 605 total students for the on-campus program.

The incoming, campus-based class is diverse, with students from 24 states, Puerto Rico and 12 countries, Randolph said. Ten percent of the new students are international.

Student-athletes represent 66% of the incoming class.

Woods Online and graduate students, is anticipated to be about 1,200 students, which includes those who will start in October.

The college continues to see growth and success in its nursing programs, Randolph said. It also has its second incoming class of graduate students pursuing a master of science in equine studies.

Among the new freshman on campus is Dante Adams of Fayetteville, Ark., who will play on the men's basketball team. He is an exercise science major.

He's been on campus for about a week. "It's exciting

Another student moving into Le Fer Hall Friday was Landrie Hayes of Terre Haute; she is majoring in business.
