A virtual component will be offered to meet the needs of those who cannot attend in person. There is no cost to attend the Into The Woods session.





# C.A.M.P. at The Woods

## June 7-14, 2026



High school students who are rising sophomores, juniors or seniors are encouraged to apply to participate in the Challenging Ambitions and Maximizing Potential or C.A.M.P. at The Woods program and earn two college credits! The program will be facilitated on the SMWC campus from June 7 – 14, 2026 (7 days) as a day camp program from 7:30 a.m. – 5 p.m. Eastern Time daily on June 7, 8, and 9 then a discovery trip is planned for each session from June 10 – 13 with all sessions reconvening on campus on June 14. Students accepted into the program from outside the local area will need to plan for their own lodging – please reach out to us if suggestions are needed.

Applications open February 2, 2026.  
Applications close March 2.  
Candidates will be selected and notified by March 6.  
The registration fee is \$250.  
The first payment of \$100 is due March 27, 2026.  
The remaining \$150 is due by May 1, 2026. This fee covers all daily activities, breakfast and lunch daily.



## The four C.A.M.P. Courses

The four C.A.M.P. courses are facilitated by key faculty in the academic content areas of **Global Leadership, Equine Industry, Nursing, and Teacher Education**. Participants who complete C.A.M.P. at The Woods earn 2 SMWC credit hours.

### Choose one of these four:

#### **DISCOVERY ADVENTURES – ED 150: STEM APPLICATIONS IN THE ELEMENTARY CLASSROOM**



This course introduces high school students to elementary teaching through designing hands-on STEM activities for kids while learning teaching strategies from building things to solving real problems as a team. You'll develop creative thinking and collaboration skills that prepare you to inspire the next generation of learners.



#### **DISCOVERY ADVENTURES – NU 150: NURSES OF THE FUTURE**



This C.A.M.P. course is for students considering nursing as a profession and includes topics focused on the expansive role of the professional nurse, the history of nursing, nursing ethics, professional communication, career opportunities, the use of technology and basic nursing skills.



#### **DISCOVERY ADVENTURES – GL 150: LEADERS OF POSITIVE CHANGE**



Students will explore global leadership, change management, and digital marketing strategies as they create a project for positive change designed to make a difference within a community and beyond. Through hands-on cultural experiences and collaborative initiatives, you'll expand your perspective and develop skills that help you think bigger about solving problems that matter.



#### **DISCOVERY ADVENTURES – EQ 150: INTRODUCTION TO EQUINE INDUSTRY**



This course is designed to introduce pre-college students to the world of equine studies. Students will learn introductory horse handling, riding, grooming and general care instruction, as well as an introduction to the science of the equine industry (nutrition, reproduction, and general physiology of the horse).

#### **DISCOVERY ADVENTURES**

Four courses are offered this year at C.A.M.P. at The Woods and each will include both an on-campus and discovery travel immersive experience connected to the course. Funding for travel is provided by the Indiana Youth Programs on Campus, a Lilly Endowment, Inc. grant. No passports will be required.
